World Traveller

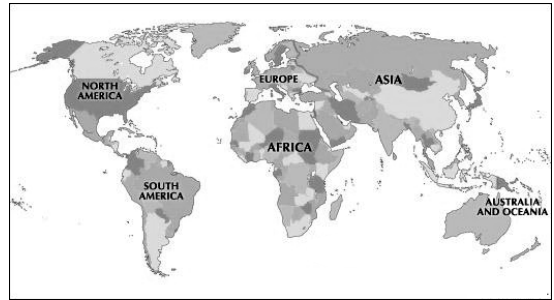
Nick Pearson loves his work. He's a British actor and he travels around the world making TV programmes.
